REFLECTION



Dear Friends,

In May of 2021, I knew that becoming the Executive Director at Flourish Furnishings was the right move. While I've been in non-profit work for a long time, I wanted to be part of a movement, something making a real difference in Kansas City.

I remember my very first month at Flourish and seeing just how important shopping for their very own furnishings was for our clients. For many of them, their appointment has been the culmination of many things leading them to that point. It is often filled with much hope and expectation as they see all this stuff being loaded into their trucks, helping them have a sense that things are going to be okay for them.

It is not unusual for me to see a kid's face light up when we roll that furniture down the ramp to their truck. Several have told me how excited they are to have a bed all to themselves. Countless clients cry in relief when they realize they don't have to spend thousands of dollars (that they don't have) to outfit their new home with furniture and housewares.

James, a veteran who was referred to us for help getting back on his feet, stood in the lobby and shouted a huge thank you and blessing to all of us. "You remind me that there is so much good in this world," he said. There were tears in most eyes that morning.

Through all the challenges our community faced in 2021, Flourish Furnishings continued to be laser-focused on its mission, serving 760 families. Building on this movement, we hope to serve 900 or more in 2022. Kids are in beds, families are at tables, and meals can be cooked and eaten with the goods that we provide.

Momentum is growing and the movement is building. Won't you join us in 2022?

OVERVIEW



MISSION To improve lives by providing essential home furnishings to those seeking housing stability.

As THE furniture bank of Kansas City, Flourish Furnishings distributes free furniture, bedding, cookware, and more to families and individuals experiencing poverty and/or houselessness. In 2021, we fully furnished **760 homes** composed of **1,853** household members, including 907 children.

We partnered with **69 social service agencies** ranging from mental health centers to domestic violence shelters to refugee resettlement agencies. While each person had a unique story, everyone we served suffered from losing their home or belongings, with **85%** having been previously unhoused.

317 volunteers contributed **17,141** hours to collect, repair, and distribute furnishings to our clients. Volunteers offered skills ranging from woodworking to accounting. Their service had a big impact by empowering families to establish comfortable, permanent homes.

We distributed a total of **30,475 items**. Through our reuse initiatives, we diverted **208** tons of waste from the landfill by transforming unwanted furniture into a resource for those in need.







Housing is only the first step to establishing a home. In 2021, we fully furnished **760 homes** for clients transitioning from homelessness to housing stability. A stable home is a place where families can rest, cook meals, spend time together, and feel the sense of security needed to pursue larger goals. While everyone had a unique story, each had been affected by poverty and displacement. Furniture and household items helped create more permanent homes for a total of **1,853 people**, including 907 children. We hope to assist 900 households in 2022.

Our clients faced a wide range of hardships and circumstances, resulting in **85%** having previously experienced homelessness. A furnished home is essential to long-term success, especially for the **87%** of clients with incomes at or below the poverty level. Whole-home furnishings are an economic boost while laying foundations for a long-term, safe, and comfortable home.

2021 TOP REASONS FOR REFERRAL



Loss of Home - 154 clients lost their home due to foreclosure or eviction, many of whom experienced houselessness for one or more months.



Domestic Violence – 126 clients were forced to leave their home due to domestic violence, leaving them without resources or belongings.



Mental Illness – 118 clients were affected by mental illness, and were establishing a new home as part of their ongoing treatment and support plan.



Disability - 114 clients were referred due to disabilities that made home furnishings unobtainable, from financial to physical barriers.




Incarceration - 77 clients were re-entering independent living after having been incarcerated, with few resources to establish a new home.




Job Loss - 60 clients lost their jobs, causing financial hardship and limiting their ability to furnish their home while providing basic living necessities.





RACE & ETHNICITY




In 2021, Flourish Furnishings provided whole-home furnishings for **760 homes.** Our service impacted 1,853 people, including **907 children and 946 adults.**

PERIOD OF HOUSELESSNESS

previously experienced the trauma of homelessness. Being unhoused robs families of their belongings, social support, and physical and mental well-being. We aim to restore hope and security by empowering families to rebuild their sense of home. More than 60% of our clients were unhoused for 4 or more months.









Bailey was referred to Flourish Furnishings by Hope House, a domestic violence center providing survivors with shelter and comprehensive services. Bailey worked with case managers to secure a new place to live after being forced to flee an abusive situation. Domestic violence survivors are forced to rebuild not only their home, but their sense of security and well-being. With the help of our volunteers, Bailey chose furniture, bedding, kitchen items, and décor for her new home. Her time at Flourish Furnishings was an essential step in recovery after experiencing trauma. We hope that Bailey and her daughter find peace and happiness as they move forward!







Sylvester was referred to Flourish Furnishings by the Veterans Administration, the resource center of Veterans Affairs. He worked with case managers to secure housing in addition to a range of other employment, health, and education services. Flourish Furnishings serves as an essential resource in conjunction with organizations like the Veterans Administration to serve those experiencing hardships including PTSD, disability, and financial barriers. At Flourish, Sylvester chose everything he needed to make his new place feel like home. It is our privilege to help veterans like him on their journey to happiness, security, and success!



We partnered with 69 social service agencies who served a diverse range of communities, from mental health centers to domestic violence shelters to refugee resettlement agencies. As a centralized source for whole-home furnishings, we saved case managers time and money by providing everything needed to furnish our shared clients' homes. Working together allows our partners to put their valuable resources towards funding essential services and programs.

Our partner agencies provide wrap-around support to clients, including housing, employment, health, and family services. Home furnishings are a barrier for many living with low incomes. Our resources are an essential step to establishing a permanent home, pursuing employment, and maintaining health and happiness.

Our core purpose at Safehome, the only domestic violence shelter in Johnson County, is to provide a healing atmosphere where survivors of domestic abuse can gain inner strength, explore options, and be empowered to live a life free of abuse. We could not accomplish our mission without the help of our partner agencies, and one of the biggest ways we can help someone move on in their life is by our partnership with Flourish Furnishings.

Domestic violence survivors can very often feel disempowered, alone, and fearful of the future as they try to rebuild a life free from abuse. Home is a refuge for most of us, where we feel safe and at peace, but for victims of domestic abuse, this is not the case.



VOLUNTEERS



Flourish is led by a passionate and dedicated community of volunteers. We strive to make our 28,000 square foot facility feel like home in 8 different departments. Flourish volunteers are the heart and soul of Flourish, and meeting our clients' needs is always the top priority.

Specially trained "personal shoppers" guide our clients through the showroom, assisting with their selections. We offer lovingly prepared and organized bathroom and kitchen kits. We clean furniture, carpentry teams make repairs, sewing teams repurpose fabric, and our electrical teams test and refurbish anything with wiring. Our dish teams combine beautiful sets of plates, glassware, tablecloths, and placemats in boxed sets.

In 2021, 317 volunteers contributed 17,141 hours of labor, equivalent to an estimated value of \$489,000. We are so grateful for our kind, fun-loving, and hard-working volunteers!






















Thanks to our volunteers' hard work repairing and refurbishing donations, we distributed **30,475 furnishings** – saving **208 tons** of unwanted household items from the landfill. 



Flourish Furnishings operated with a budget of \$369,603 thanks to generous donations from **individuals**, **businesses**, **foundations**, and **non-profit partners**. Funding supports the essential functions of our mission to furnish homes.

As the hub of our operations, the **warehouse** serves as a work area, a furniture showroom, and our administrative offices.

Our **two moving trucks** enable volunteers to collect donations from 400+ businesses and residences.

Although our **inventory of household items and furniture** is mostly donated, we purchase additional home goods when supply runs low.

With only **two full-time employees**, our service is run by the dedication of our 300+ volunteers and network of furniture donors.
