By collecting, repairing, and providing donated furniture and home essentials for the entire home, Flourish impacts lives.**



## Abundance, Transformation, and Equilibrium

Abundance, transformation, and equilibrium are ever-present themes at Flourish, Kansas City's only furniture bank. They are what have helped us serve an incredible 1,069 families in 2023!

Our community has great abundance. When redistribution takes place, there is enough for everyone. Each morning at Flourish, we are greeted by new items that have arrived from homes and businesses across our city and are ready for our loving care as we prepare them to be the foundation for a new home space for a family in our community. Our staff and our volunteers are sometimes overwhelmed by the abundance that comes in our door but are constantly reminded that each day, we have an opportunity to fill 8 moving trucks with an ENTIRE home of furniture and home essentials for families and that each week we could deeply impact the lives of 32 families who are our neighbors.

That's the equilibrium we seek. Our volunteers and staff partner with our donors that include neighbors, hotels, estate sales, moving companies, churches, and a wide array of other businesses to bring 7-8 moving trucks of furniture and home furnishings into our 29,000 square foot warehouse space to be sorted, cleaned, repaired and renewed.

We then showcase these items for 8 families to choose from and fill 7-8 moving trucks that leave our space each day. This is hard work and is only possible through the 27,014 volunteer hours devoted to this mission in 2023.

At the same time, Flourish is a big part of the circular economy in Kansas City. Every item we bring in has the potential to have gone to a landfill instead of to a home in need. Every item repaired in our woodworking or upholstery space would have been discarded. Items that cannot be given away in their current form are transformed. For instance, a bedspread made of an overabundance of bed skirts or pillow shams. The creativity expressed in our space is inspiring and gratifying.

The end result is the transformation of our community from one where hundreds of families are living without ANY furniture or home essentials in their space to a community where resources are shared, and families have furnishings that allow them to live in a dignified way.

It is good work. Thank you for supporting us in our efforts to redistribute abundance, transform our community, and find equilibrium in this very special and unique mission.

# FINANCIALS

In 2023, 335 individuals, foundations, businesses, and nonprofits contributed \$674,376 to fund Flourish's operating expenses. These critical expenses included occupancy fees for 29,000 sq ft of warehouse space, a small staff, truck fuel and maintenance for our pickup program, and supplies for our shopping showroom and repair workshops.

Flourish collected 360 tons of furniture at an estimated value of \$1,255,262 from businesses and individuals in the community. Flourish, the furniture bank of Kansas City, furnished 1,069 homes in areas across all five counties of the metro area in 2023. That doesn't mean just a couch, or a bed, or a few home items. We provided everything needed to make these houses feel like home: from the big essentials, like beds and kitchen tables, to the tiny details, like artwork and bathroom items.

Having a furnished home is one of the most important factors in establishing long-term homes for people at risk of being unhoused. We directed furnishings to those transitioning to stable housing. Many of our guests were families, and 1,348 children are among the 2,573 household members living in now-furnished homes.

# Dignity.

While each person's story is different, everyone who visits Flourish has experienced loss and worked hard to become housed. For many guests, Flourish is the final steppingstone to independence. When families are referred to shop, we eliminate cost barriers while providing an uplifting and dignified shopping experience to fully furnish their new home.

274 guests were referred after experiencing foreclosure, loss of home, eviction, or unsafe living conditions.

180 guests fled their homes due to domestic violence.

151 guests were living with a disability, and 132 were living with mental illness.

112 guests were referred due to job loss or medical bills.

66 guests were re-entering from incarceration.

53 guests were recovering from substance abuse.

29 guests were refugees, and 29 were immigrants.

29 guests experienced a fire or natural disaster.

14 guests were aging out of foster care.

# Choice.

The foundation of Flourish's shopping appointment is choice. Through a wide variety of options displayed on our showroom floor, each of our guests is empowered to find the large and small essentials needed to make their home feel like THEIR OWN.

Tony visited Flourish hoping to find something that reminded him of his childhood. While shopping, he discovered a doily like the ones that adorned his grandmother's home. Upon further investigation, Ruth, his showroom host, realized the sewing department had an entire bin.

At Flourish, we recognize the importance of the little things. By providing a selection of items to meet many needs and preferences, we empower our families with items that are not only functional, but deeply personal.

Through donations from a wide community network and the dedicated refurbishing efforts of our volunteers, we create a safe, uplifting space where our guests have the time to choose everything needed for their space.

# Community.

The greatest impact of a furnished home is its ability to create community for a family. Whether that looks like inviting friends over to celebrate or spending quiet time with loved ones, our homes are the center of our social and emotional lives.

Mary had an appointment to shop at Flourish late last year. She was assisted by Ruth, a volunteer showroom host, who helped guide their hour long appointment.

As they were walking down the baking aisle, Mary's eyes lit up when she saw this dainty floral apron. Perfect for baking treats for her grandkids!

After shopping for a bed, upholstered furniture, wooden items, lots of cookware and baking items, linens, decorations, and electronics, it was time to load everything up. A large group of family and friends was there to help move her furniture.

With collaboration from many individuals, our community rallied around Mary to make sure she had everything she needed.

A team of 670 volunteered at Flourish in 2023. Not only do these volunteers collect donated furniture and assist our guests through their shopping experiences, but they do so much work behind the scenes. Our dedicated community of passionate individuals is essential to every part of our process. In 2023, volunteers gave 27,014 hours of service to furnish homes. That's an average of 25 hours per home furnished!

Flourish's volunteer culture is like no other in Kansas City. With compassion, creativity, and a sense of humor, volunteers worked to empower families in the community. Their efforts, valued at the \$33.49 hourly rate based on the national standard in 2023, added an estimated \$904,698 in value to the city's furniture bank.

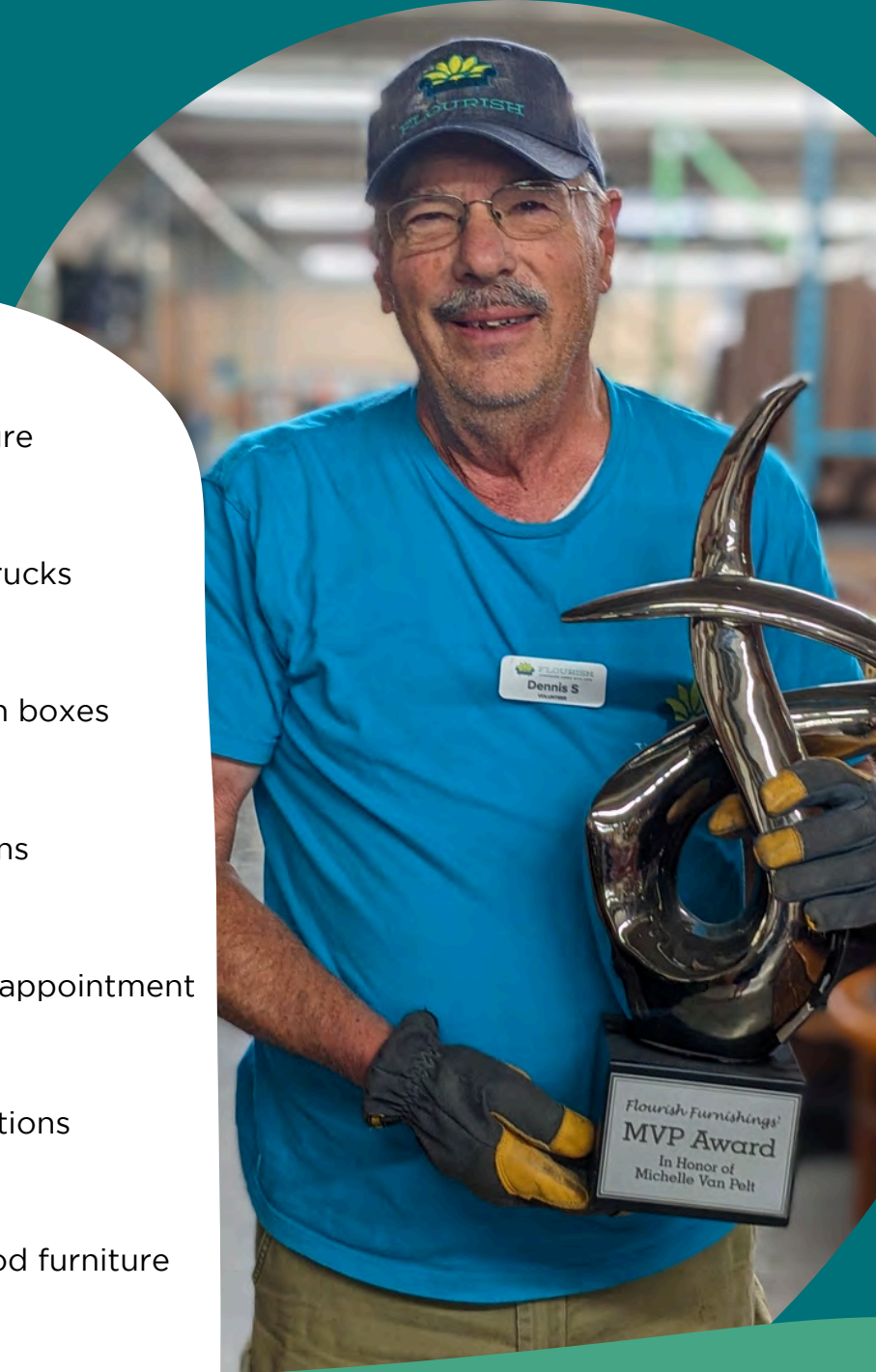

## Service.

“How can I help?” This question fuels Flourish’s daily operations. With 32 homes-worth of items coming in and exiting again every week, there are endless tasks to be completed in order to sort, clean, repair, and display high-quality furniture and household items for hundreds of families throughout the year.

Luckily, Flourish volunteers are driven by their hearts of service. Whether they are vacuuming under couch cushions, tightening dresser handles, color-coordinating dish sets, or creating special floral arrangements, volunteers bring immense care to every item and person who enters our doors. It’s the individual attention and genuine desire to help from each of our volunteers that makes our model truly sustainable and socially impactful.

# Compassion.

Treating others with kindness is just the beginning. Our showroom hosts exemplify empathy and compassion with every action on our showroom floor. A showroom host is a specially trained volunteer who goes through a three step process to become the support that our guests will receive during their shopping experience. A lesson on trauma-informed care, an orientation through Flourish, and lastly, a chance to shadow other trained showroom hosts rounds out the training our hosts receive before they are able to shop with our guests. Showing our guests compassion through dignity of choice, they serve as a friend and guide to help our families flourish with the items that they pick out.

## Collaboration.

Volunteers from Omega Psi Phi Fraternity come each month to jump in and help where needed. Whether it's loading furniture on to trucks or picking items from our showroom floor, these gentlemen ensure every item and every person is treated with the respect they deserve.



# Creativity.

Flourish volunteers are experts at seeing potential in every donation we receive. There is immense creativity in working from what you have, instead of what you wish you had. By cleaning, refurbishing, and repairing furniture and household goods before they go to their new family, volunteers add immeasurable value through their imaginations. From refinishing a wooden tabletop, to recovering the cushions of a sofa, to creating blankets from fabric scraps, or curating mismatched items into neatly coordinated sets, Flourish volunteers make a huge impact through their creativity and craftsmanship. Their talent keeps hundreds of tons of items out of the landfill, instead filling the homes of families overcoming a great variety of challenging circumstances.

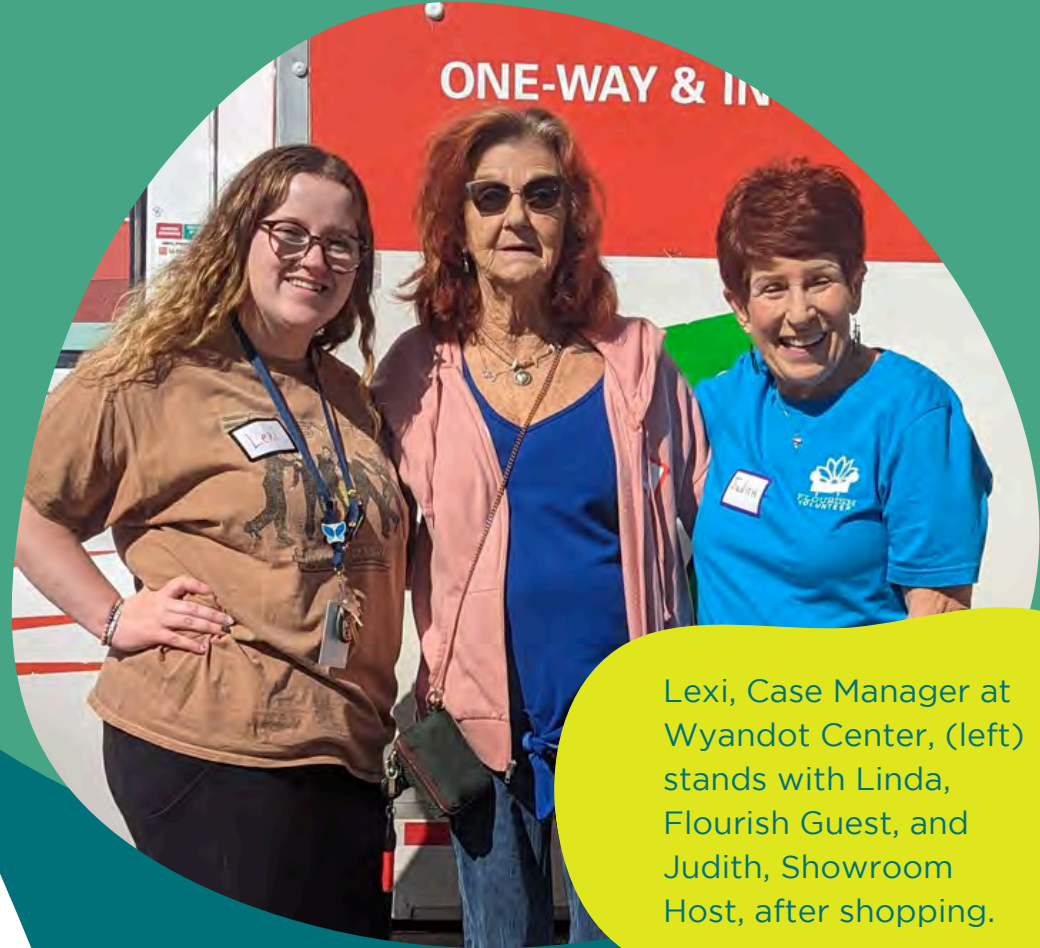

## Social Service Partners

In 2023, Flourish partnered with 80 critical social service agencies across the Kansas City metro area and beyond for shopping appointment referrals. Each of our partners provides wrap-around case management services, including domestic violence shelters, unhoused outreach services, community centers, schools, hospitals, refugee resettlement services, and many others. As a one-stop-shop for free furnishings, we save agencies and their case managers time and money securing furniture for their clients' new housing. With a \$175 annual fee and a \$75-\$100 fee per appointment, we multiply the impact of case management by empowering families with everything they need to create a comfortable, personal space.

# Reconciliation Services

Reconciliation Services is a Kansas City nonprofit that refers families to Flourish. In 2023, eight families within their case management furnished their homes through Flourish. With programs that strategically meet needs for food access, safe environments, and mental health services, they touch hundreds of families to address the root causes and symptoms of poverty in our city.

Alexis Martin, Social Services Manager at Reconciliation Services, emphasized the importance of having a furnished home for families overcoming poverty and housing insecurity in these words:

Journey to New Life is a prison re-entry organization that understands the deep importance of home and belonging. For families re-entering life after incarceration, a furnished home plays a special role. Many individuals are left with nothing but the clothes they're wearing. Social networks of support are also often lost, leaving folks isolated from their usual sources of help. Our community plays a vital function in restoring a sense of hope, dignity, and community through the shopping appointment referral program. Together, we aid our guests' journey towards healing and happiness.

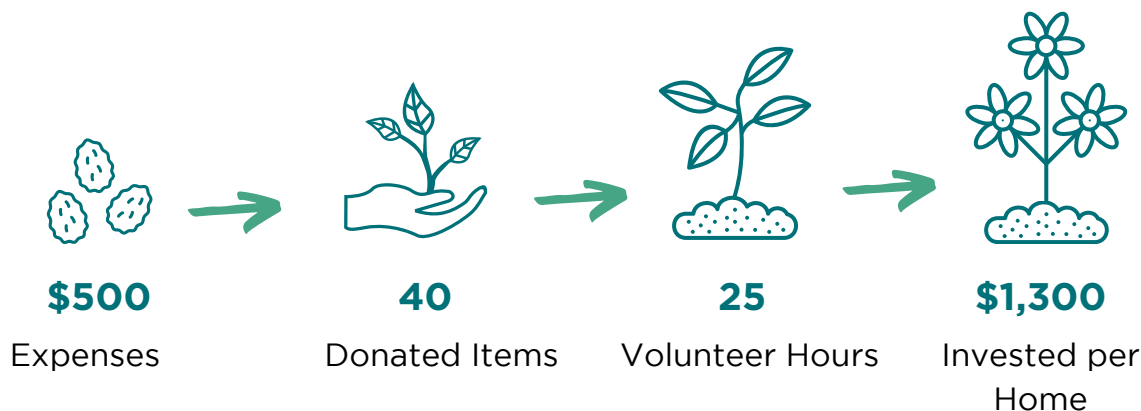
# Our Collective Impact

Our partnership-based model involves contributions from every sector of our community. Every home furnished comes at a cost of \$500 in Flourish operating expenses. These critical funds fuel our warehouse and workshop, our moving trucks, our small staff, and our volunteer repair supplies. Next, 40 items are donated by individuals in the community. Then, volunteers spend 25 hours cleaning, repairing, and displaying the items. Finally, families receive an estimated value of \$1,300 in donated furniture. More importantly, they're all items that they chose.

By meeting the unique needs of many people in our community with diverse needs, our operations are both environmentally sustainable and socially impactful. Every contribution makes a tremendous difference by directly providing comfort, safety, and dignity to a family in Kansas City.

# Blessings Abound Thrift Store

Blessings Abound forms a key piece of Flourish's foundation of support. This incredible community-based thrift store in Overland Park has a unique mission: direct all business proceeds back to Kansas City nonprofits. Blessings Abound contributes to Flourish with a monthly grant. Blessings Abound is also a weekly furniture donor. Blessings Abound staff and volunteers set aside still-good furniture pieces for our weekly pickup. By saving extra items to give to families, this amazing organization has a transformative impact for hundreds of families in the area.

Last year, Blessings Abound contributed 2,034 items weighing an estimated 117,058 pounds directly to our showroom. Blessings Abound is a community hub for both businesses and nonprofits: their support elevates and multiplies our impact for the entire metro region.

# Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints granted Flourish support for a special project: beds for families. We frequently run short on donated mattresses and bed frames due to our strict standards. Understanding the importance of a clean, brand new bed, particularly for families with young children, the LDS Church jumped in to bridge a critical gap in our services. With volunteer support and grant funding, the church purchased a total of 400 new beds for families in Kansas City.

Their support ensured that every family we saw last year had the option of a safe and comfortable place to rest. The importance of their contribution cannot be overstated - beds are everything!

# Mid-America Regional Council Solid Waste Management District

The Mid-America Regional Council Solid Waste Management District and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources partner with Flourish to divert waste in the Kansas City, Missouri region. Their support funded new truck wraps and marketing pieces for Flourish's moving trucks, to increase awareness during our pickup routes. They contributed to our pick-up program by supporting a new Driver & Warehouse Generalist staff position.

With the support of MARC SWMD and MDNR, in 2023 we diverted an additional 50 tons of waste from landfills in Jackson, Platte, Clay, and Cass Counties in Missouri.
